



### RIGOROUS AND JOYFUL ACADEMIC EXPERIENCE

Nationwide, nearly half of all students perform below grade level in at least one subject, most often reading or math.\* To address this, Aspire has adopted a multi-pronged approach to ensure our scholars are receiving a rigorous and joyful academic experience that cultivates their unique skills, talents, and gifts.

#### TARGETED LITERACY INTERVENTION

When scholars returned to campuses last fall, we committed to providing robust reading instruction and ample supplemental interventions to support scholars who missed instruction during Distance Learning. Teachers and schools utilize "The Science of Reading" to ground instruction in research-based, structured foundational skill development that includes both language comprehension and word recognition.



#### **INVESTING IN OUR TEACHERS**

Joyful schools are led by joyful educators. We know that burnout is driving teachers out of the classroom in unprecedented numbers, so we are investing in wellness coaching for our educators. Through both individual and group coaching, educators strengthen their social-emotional competencies and improve their holistic well-being.

#### BUILDING OUT POST-SECONDARY PATHWAYS

Reflecting our commitment to our mission, our secondary schools provide multiple post-secondary pathways to scholars, including the opportunity to earn an associate's degree by the time they graduate high school. For example, Aspire Lionel Wilson College Preparatory Academy is partnering with Laney College to build out a multi-course Engineering Design program for high school scholars that will allow them to obtain college credit and real-world experience.

# INCLUSIVITY AND EQUITY

Aspire is committed to providing equitable opportunities for our students, families, and teammates. We use an equity lens to examine our policies, practices, and systems at Aspire to strive for all groups to increase access and benefit from our work. This belief is woven throughout our core values.



#### LIFTING UP BLACK EXCELLENCE

We lift up Black Excellence—programs that teach about, celebrate, and honor Black culture—throughout our schools. Throughout the year and especially during Black History Month, our schools celebrate Black excellence and bring together scholars and families to experience projects and performances dedicated to Black creatives in our country's history. Black Student Unions (BSUs) are at most Aspire secondary schools and many of our elementary schools.

#### **CREATING EDUCATOR PATHWAYS**

Through a partnership with Rivet School, Aspire teammates can enroll in an accelerated, affordable bachelor's degree program to help aspiring educators expedite their pathway toward becoming teachers. Additionally, Aspire offers a teacher residency program in partnership with Alder Graduate School of Education. Over the course of one year, teacher residents apprentice in an experienced teacher's classroom while earning a master's degree and California Teaching Credential.



#### SERVING SCHOLARS WITH DISABILITIES

Aspire brings students of all abilities into shared classrooms in a co-teaching model that pairs special and general education teachers. This research-backed approach has demonstrated that all students benefit socially and academically when students with disabilities are included in general education classrooms.

## ABILITY, IDENTITY, AND COMMUNITY

We strive to create safe, inclusive, and welcoming learning environments where students feel pride and connection to their schools.



#### **POST-SECONDARY SCHOLARSHIPS**

Through the generosity of our donors, the Aspire Public Schools Foundation offers 29 scholarships totaling almost \$50,000 to Aspire graduating seniors as they embark on their post-secondary pathways. Recipients are selected through a robust application process, and they exemplify tenacity, the ability to be agents of change, and a commitment to creating a culture of belonging in their communities.

#### **INCREASED MENTAL HEALTH SUPPORTS**

Coming out of the pandemic, we are focused on the mental health and well-being of our scholars. Our goal is to support every scholar's needs in a timely, caring, and equitable manner. Our schools have increased their use of individual and small group sessions to address issues including self-regulation, grief and loss, social skills, and healthy relationships.

#### FOCUSING ON TEAMMATE WELLNESS

We aim to take care of the people who care for our scholars, so that we all flourish in our school communities. For example, we partnered with Generation Thrive (created by The Warriors Community Foundation and Kaiser Permanente) to provide our Bay Area schools education and wellness programming including yoga, dance classes, and healthy cooking demonstrations.
