Drop Off and Pick-Up Procedures

On time drop off and pick up is important to your child’s success. In order to make drop off and pick up as efficient for you, your child and other families, please follow the below procedures. In order to provide a smooth and safe dismissal the office will be closed from 2:30-3:00.

Drop Off Time: Students may be dropped off as early as 7:30 for breakfast. Students may be dropped off at the main entrance or in the back parking lot. They should go directly to the cafeteria. *Please do not drop your students off before 7:30a as there will be no one to supervise them and that creates a safety issue.*

Pick Up Time: Dismissal is at 3:00p. Please pick your student up before 3:30 if they are not in the after school program. Late pickups create safety issues for students. Please do not double park or block our neighbors’ driveways.

Early Pick-Up Policies and Procedures:

Early pickups must be someone listed in the PowerSchool list. If it is someone who is not listed the parent or guardian must call ahead of time to let the office know and have the unlisted adult bring an ID with them.

In order to maximize instruction please try your best to not pick up students early unless it is an emergency. We do understand that things come up but please try to schedule doctor appointments and other appointments after school hours or during one of our many school breaks. (see calendar)

School Site Attendance and Tardy Procedures

Regular, on-time attendance is important for your child's success. In the event your child is absent or tardy, please follow the procedures below.

- Please be sure to call the office to let us know your student will be late or absent.
- The student must bring a doctor note in order to get his/her absence excused.
- It is important that someone from our administration is made aware of this absence and or tardy.
- Students who walk into school after 8:35am are considered tardy and will be marked tardy "T".
- Students who arrive after 9:05am will be marked as "R" tardy over 30 minutes which can result in truancy if the student accumulates three.

Lunch Expectations

Triumph provides students with healthy school lunch options every day Monday-Friday. We do encourage you to send food with your student if you/ they prefer to eat something else or want snacks for recess.

Please do not use food delivery options to send lunch to students or send students to school with lunches that need to be heated. Due to limited staffing we are unable to accommodate those situations. We do not want students to be hungry during the day as they will not be able to concentrate on learning, as such, we will encourage students to eat a school lunch. A parent/guardian/ family member is able to drop off food in the front office for a student to eat at their designated lunch time. Please make sure the food is clearly labeled with the students' name and grade level.

School Site Specific Dress Code

Aspire Triumph Technology Academy expects all students to wear uniforms Monday- Friday.

We will send out any communication in advance about Spirit Days or non-uniform days via Parent Square or the Family Newsletter.

The Triumph uniform consists of:

Tops: White, Gray, or Navy Blue collared shirt OR Triumph t-shirts

- Collared shirts can be short sleeved or long sleeved and do not need a special Triumph/Aspire logo- collared shirts can be purchased at the retailer of your choice such as Target, Walmart, Old Navy, etc

Bottoms: Navy Blue, Black, or Khaki pants, shorts, skorts, jumpers, or skirts

- Shorts, skirts, skorts, and jumpers may not fall more than 3 inches above a scholar's knee
- Students may not wear pants that have an excessively tight or excessively loose fit; students may not wear leggings, sweat pants, or jeans

Cold-weather tops: Solid Navy blue, black, white, or gray sweaters, cardigans, v-necks, fleeces, or vests OR Triumph sweatshirt

Student shoes are expected to meet the following requirements:

- All shoes must have a rubber sole
- For safety reasons, heels, flip flops, sandals, wedges and open-toed shoes are not allowed. If students wear these types of shoes, they will not be allowed to participate in recess or PE.
- Students must wear shoes that enable them to participate in PE comfortably
- If a student's shoes become a distraction in class, that student will be asked to wear different shoes to school

Students do not need a separate PE uniform.

School Culture and Student Life

At Triumph we have various routines and rituals that students engage in to build community. Every morning we have a whole school assembly to start the day off in community with each other. We have Town Hall assemblies where students take pride in their "colleges" by doing their class cheers and receive awards for attendance, academics and SEL. Triumph also hosts after school cultural celebrations and academic nights so students can create a sense of belonging and inclusion. During the day students and staff engage in different activities to actively promote

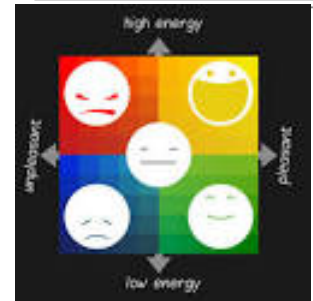
an inclusive school culture where all students can be themselves and enjoy the learning environment. We also have a robust afterschool program where students explore different types of enrichment.

Social-Emotional Learning (SEL)

At Triumph we use the Toolbox: Social Emotional Learning Curriculum and Ruler Curriculum. Toolbox is a research-based social-emotional learning curriculum. It teaches critical social competencies necessary for academic and life success such as: resiliency, self-management, and responsible decision-making skills. We use the tools school wide throughout the day. Please partner with us in using the tools at home to reinforce what is being taught at school.

RULER is an evidence-based approach to social and emotional learning (SEL) developed at the Yale Center for Emotional Intelligence. RULER supports entire school communities in:

- Understanding the value of emotions
- Building the skills of emotional intelligence
- Creating and maintaining positive school climates



Family Engagement

Our families are SO important to our success as a school. We deeply value the role families play in supporting our work and hope to call you in to be a part of our school community. We have various events, celebrations and conferences, to encourage families to be engaged in our school community. We know that school to family partnerships are integral to our success! You know your scholars better than anyone.

Additionally, we have our School Site Council (SSC) and English Language Advisory Committee (ELAC) that meets regularly throughout the year, which has opportunities for family leadership and to get involved.
